# Beware - Home Contractor Scams!

Recently two Tuscawilla homeowners were scammed by local contractors. Both situations happened to deal with roof repairs and minor exterior repairs. Both were paid an advance but never started/finished the work. We have some suggestions to help you avoid being scammed for projects you might have.

First, getting bids from two or more contractors for the same project an important starting point. You should then obtain at least two referrals from customers that have had similar work done by the contractor you are considering. It's also important to check with the WV Division of Labor (304) 558-7890 regarding the contractor's license validity and to inquire about customer complaints. Obtain a written, signed contract that details the work to be done and the costs being charged.

Finally, payments should be made by personal check.

There are also a couple of Website based contractor service evaluation companies that you can consult for information:
